The REP does not propose to have all the answers

However, our close-working relationship with the Motorcycle Safety Foundation (MSF), as well as additional GWR-RA programs and studies, has provided a wealth of information for use in establishing a comprehensive Rider Education Program. Through Commitment, Education and Application, we can reduce our accident rate significantly.

Both the motorcycle and motorist community are already realizing many positive benefits from the GWRRA Rider Education Program. Through the efforts of the Rider Education Officers and volunteers throughout the world, we will reach our goal of establishing the safest motorcycle environment possible.

GWRRA Rider Education has traditionally encouraged members to obtain and maintain certifications in First Aid and CPR (Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation). These basic skills are easily learned, but may make the difference between life and death in the critical minutes before professional help can arrive. There are a number of fine provid-

ers of this type of training available, including familiar names such as the American Red Cross and the American Heart



Association. GWRRA is a recognized corporate provider of the MEDIC FIRST AID international program.

Whatever your preferred provider, we strongly encourage you to get trained and stay current in your certification. The next Medic First Aid class will be held on April 1, 2017 and the class is now open to other chapters to attend.

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### Tidbits from the Brok...en Bit Shop – An Opinion on Suspensions and Things

Not too long ago I purchased a new set of front spring / shock units and a new pair of rear shocks for my aging 2004 Ford F-150 pickup truck in an attempt to cash-in before my friend Lynn at the local parts house decided to quit the auto parts business and focus on his hardware line. I had first noticed the original shocks were really starting to give up at about 80-90,000 miles, but had also managed to put off both the job and the expense until the truck had accumulated 120,000 miles and the original units were totally shot. That's when I finally bought the new parts from Lynn and made plans to install them right away, but plans and good intentions do not always result in things getting done. The longer story is that I wallowed and swayed on down the road for three more months before finally doing the work, and toward the end it was almost like the truck had no shocks at all.

Then one morning I finally mustered the ambition to do the installation, and my what a difference it made! Suddenly, the ole F-150 felt like new again and the contrast was amazing. Were the new units (Monroe's finest) better than the originals? Maybe, or maybe not, but they certainly hadn't been run 50,000 miles past their useful life expectancy either, and I suspect that was the real reason I noticed such a dramatic improvement. So what is my point? Well, motorcycles have springs and shocks too, and the suspensions on the late model flagship bikes like our Gold Wings are really quite good if they are maintained well.

Opinions may differ of course, but to be quite honest I was favorably impressed with the quality of the ride and handling of my 1800 the instant I first swung a leg over it. Compared to my old 1986 SEI, the 1800's suspension performance was a real joy to behold, and still is. Similar contrasts were also apparent regarding the braking system, engine power, electronics, and so forth. Technology marches on, and our modern Gold Wings are indeed highly refined and excellent performing touring machines straight out of the box.

So why is it we hear so many complaints about 1800 suspension components and so many folks opt to "update" with aftermarket components like those offered by Traxxion, Progressive Suspension and others? Well, many will say the aftermarket stuff is far superior to the stock units, and who is to say they aren't? Certainly, not me, but I must admit

a new 1800 works so well I personally think it is hard to complain about Honda's original stuff if it is maintained well. Are the Traxxion or Progressive Suspension engineering departments really superior to the mighty Honda organization and those of the original equipment manufacturers whose components they use? I think not. I also believe the real reason many folks experience what they describe as major improvements after installing after market suspension components is because their old units were worn out, just as my truck shocks were.

Am I being purposefully argumentative here? Well, I hope not. Let's just say I think the Honda stuff works so well that someone will have to show me some hard data before I change my mind. Let's be honest now. Have any disinterested third parties out there actually done a controlled comparison between new Honda units and new aftermarket units? If so, I'd sure like to see the data. I just haven't seen any solid experimental results, especially those tabulated by folks not involved in selling either stock Honda or aftermarket components. Got the picture????

I don't have any hard data, but I can say I'm very satisfied with the way the Black Diamond's suspension felt on day one and I still am. Like they say, "If it ain't broke, why fix it?" I've heard the stories about Honda's spongy hydraulic lines, that the original rear shocks are throw away types that can't be rebuilt, that the springs are of poor quality and so forth. If that is all true, why is it they seem to work so well when new? Is it that I am just stupid? Perhaps, but maybe there is also a message in my story about the old F-150 that may help to explain everything. That message is a simple one. New shocks and springs outperform old shocks and springs and that applies to both stock Honda and aftermarket units alike.

But why are some folks experiencing rather catastrophic suspension failures? I 'think' (that's what people say when they don't actually 'know' something) there may be two reasons. The first is the problem my truck had. The design and quality of the original components were fine, but I just wore them out. The second reason that applies specifically to our Gold Wings is that we simply overload them. The very same reason we hear so many stories about catastrophic tire failure or premature tire wear (also encouraged by under inflation).

Here is my opinion: There may well be better components out there than the original Honda pieces, but when trying to decide what you want or need, maybe the best advice is to follow the old tire rule. Listen to the salesman as much as you want, but sometimes the truth can best be found by reading the standardized test results branded on the sidewalls. In the case of suspension components you may have to look elsewhere for solid data, but why not do that before putting cash on the line?

As always, everyone has a different set of conditions, likes and desires and I'll be happy to hear and accept your opinions as well. Meanwhile, it is not true that Honda shocks cannot be rebuilt, and I'll leave you with a quote from Stu Oltman's Workbench column in the March, 2012 Issue of Wing World: "I haven't had the opportunity to sample a GL 1800 equipped with Traxxion's rear suspension components, so I couldn't offer a valid comparison between that and original components". Ditto for me.

OK, I've said my piece and have my flack jacket on. The floor is open for discussion and I'd love to hear what you have to say and promise to stand corrected if you show me the data.


